Rosedanie Cadet was born in Haiti and lived there until the age of 10, when she moved with her family to Brooklyn, New York. An island person at heart, Rosedanie settled on Orcas Island 3 years ago. In December 2009, Rosedanie returned to Haiti and visited her family's hometown of Limbé, where the seeds of the Noramise project began to germinate in her mind. Rosedanie had found her life's purpose: to start a sustainable farming project with the people of Limbé, with the goal of creating a micro-development model for the region.

Two weeks after she arrived back in the US, the earthquake hit Haiti, sparking even more urgency for her work. Her history and experiences all converged at this defining moment in her life, and Rosedanie knew the time was right to launch Helping Hands Noramise, a non-profit project named in honor of her grandmother.
